Aaron Brincks presented the Fire Department report. There were 3 paged calls; they held their business meeting and training night donating 99.5 hours of community service.

Chief Ward presented the Police Department report. He stated it was a very busy month with the tractorcade and fireman's dance in Ossian. They have also spend considerable time patrolling 175th. Street due to the speed limit change on this street. There were two arrests with several ongoing investigations in progress.

Junior Boyer presented his street department report, stating it has been very busy with the street project. He reported that the speed limit signs on 175th have been changed to 25MPH and that two more will be installed with flags to attract more attention. He stated that they had been working to get the scoreboard at the little league field working and all should now be operating properly. Bird nests were removed from the little league lights, and security cameras were installed at the swimming pool. The surfacing of Lewis Street between Melden and Jefferson was discussed. Junior will check into the cost of concrete, asphalt and tar and chips. He had obtained a bid for 4" of asphalt at a cost of approximately \$ 25,000.

Don Wurtzel, Economic Director reported that he had approached the Depot Outlet Board and they approved a contribution of \$ 2099.00 to the Freedom Rock project. This means they have paid for the flag poles and flags in full. Don reported that the Dollar General should open in early August and the Subway sometime in September.

Motion by Schissel, second by Ondrashek to approve Resolution # 543 setting a hearing to consider an easement to address the Habitat House encroachment issue. Aye: Sabelka, Schissel, Ondrashek and Kirkeberg. Motion carried.

Motion by Kirkeberg, second by Sabelka to approve Resolution # 541 setting a hearing to consider the conveyance of city property (Brandon Albertson, Dena Johnston & Gerald Langreck). Aye: Sabelka, Schissel, Kirkeberg & Ondrashek. Motion carried.

Motion by Schissel, second by Ondrashek to approve Resolution # 540 setting salaries for city employees effective July 1, 2016. Aye: Sabelka, Schissel, Ondrashek and Kirkeberg. Motion carried.

Motion by Sabelka, second by Schissel to approve Resolution # 542 authorizing the city of Calmar to purchase a parcel of real estate. Aye: Sabelka, Schissel, Kirkeberg and Ondrashek. Motion carried.

Discussion was held regarding the proposed 28E agreement between the City of Calmar, The City of Ossian, the City of Spillville and NICC to enter into a joint administrative agreement for the South Winn Park and Recreation Department/position. Don Wurtzel explained the agreement and the ordinance that established the Park & Recreation Department. After discussion a motion was made by Sabelka, second by Kirkeberg to approve the agreement as presented. Aye: Sabelka, Schissel, Ondrashek and Kirkeberg. Motion carried. Motion by Schissel, second by Kirkeberg to appoint Brian Ondrashek as the City of Calmar's representative to the board. Aye: Sabelka, Schissel & Kirkeberg. Ondrashek abstained. Motion carried.

Motion by Sabelka, second by Kirkeberg to approve Ordinance # 389 establishing a park & recreation department for the City of Calmar. Aye: Kirkeberg, Ondrashek, Schissel & Sabelka. Motion carried. Motion by Sabelka, second by Kirkeberg to waive the second and third readings and make the ordinance effective upon publication. Aye: Kirkeberg, Ondrashek, Schissel & Sabelka. Motion by Sabelka, second by Kirkeberg to appoint Michele Elsbernd and Dennis Kleve to the Park & Recreation Commission. Aye: Kirkeberg, Ondrashek, Schissel & Sabelka. Motion carried.

Jeremy Bril was present to explain the Storm Water Management Ordinance. Motion by Ondrashek, second by Schissel to approve Ordinance # 390 establishing Storm Water Management. Aye: Sabelka, Schissel, Kirkeberg and Ondrashek. Motion by Ondrashek, second by Schissel to waive the second and third readings of Ordinance # 390 to be in effect upon publication. Aye: Schissel, Sabelka, Ondrashek and Kirkeberg. Motion carried.

Motion by Kirkeberg, second by Schissel to approve Ordinance # 391 amending provisions for minimum standards of development in the current sub-division ordinance. Aye: Kirkeberg, Ondrashek, Sabelka and Schissel. Motion carried. Motion by Kirkeberg, second by Schissel to waive the second and third readings of Ordinance # 391. Aye: Kirkeberg, Sabelka, Ondrashek and Schissel. Motion carried.
