February 4, 2013

Prior to the meeting Isaac Phillips, Emergency Management Representative stated he had attended the recent meeting with nothing memorable to report. Mayor Meyer reported he had attended the recent Solid Waste Meeting. He learned that Calmar had deposited 1,023 tons of waste in the landfill last year. He also said that the landfill had a 12-14 year life span remaining and that the agency had around 6 million dollars on hand for the closing costs. Discussed briefly was the idea of applying for a grant for recycle tubs for Calmar homeowners to store their recyclables.

The regular meeting of the Calmar City Council was called to order by Mayor Corey Meyer at 7:04 P.M. on Monday, February 4, 2013 at the Calmar Fire Station. The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Members present were: Kleve, Sabelka, Zweibahmer, Phillips and Huinker.

Motion by Zweibahmer, second by Phillips to approve the consent agenda (agenda, minutes of the January 7, 2013, clerk/treasurer report, claims and the ABD license for Kwik Star). Aye: Kleve, Sabelka, Zweibahmer, Huinker and Phillips. Motion carried.

The Fire Department report was presented. The department held a training night on January 28, 2013, also Hazmat recertification and several members also attended the County Fire Meeting. The department plans to hold their annual Texas Holdum Tournament on March 23rd. Council was informed on the status of the kitchen remodel project.

The Police Department report was presented. It was reported to be a busy month with officers spending time on several narcotics investigations in both towns. They also spent time on snow removal parking issues in both towns. The department has also applied for a grant to install an in car camera in the Explorer and plans to apply for other grants

thru the Federal System for other needed equipment. Chief Ward stated the Charger would be having the front end damage repaired this week. The vehicle had a small run in with a raccoon.

The Street Department report was presented. Time was spent on snow and ice removal and equipment repair and maintenance. Junior Boyer presented cost figures on a new sander/spreader. This would be used to apply salt on the sidewalks in the winter and apply weed and feed in the summer. He had a price of \$ 450 for metal and \$ 579 for plastic. He will check to compare prices and consult with the street committee. The Calmar Visioning city entrance signage project was discussed briefly. Quotes have been received for the letters and lighting but still need clarification and pricing on various mounting options.

The Water/wastewater report was presented. The annual water/wastewater report was also available for review. Matt explained that Well # 3 is now pumping 300 gpm compared to 341 gpm previously. This could be due to a variety of reasons which could be a hole in the pipe or dirt in the screen. Matt stated that usually wells are pulled and checked every 7-9 years. They are consulting with George Tekippe who will check with Cahoy and get back to Matt for review at the March meeting. Matt also explained the issues with the Natural Gas Generator at the water treatment plant.

Mayor Meyer stated that he is the representative for the Turkey River Watershed Authority. The lowa Flood Center is providing approximately 6 million in funding for selected areas. He said that Calmar might be chosen for this urban and rural flood management funding. A community meeting will be held on April 4, 2013 at NICC regarding this. More information will be forthcoming via area media. Corey encouraged council members to attend a meeting on February 5, 2013 at Upper Explorerland in Decorah. Discussed will be a possible LMI study and other ways they can help the City accomplish our Visioning goals.

The Mayor has a conflict with the normal scheduled meeting in March. After discussion the date of the March meeting will be on Tuesday, February 26, 2013 at 7:00 P.M. at the Calmar Fire Station.

Motion by Phillips, second by Huinker to set the public hearing for the 2013-2014 budget for February 26, 2013 at 7:00 P.M. at the Calmar Fire Station. Aye: Phillips, Huinker, Zweibahmer, Sabelka and Kleve. Motion carried.

The proposed budget amendment for the 2012-2013 budget will be delayed until April or May.

Material on the NLC Service Line Warranty program was presented. The council is receptive to having a representative explain the program when it can be arranged.

The clerk reported that there were three grants submitted to Winneshiek County Community Foundation. For City signage, pool pergola and Explorer in car camera. She also reported that the second installment of \$ 600 from the Black Hills Energy grant had been received.

Insurance Agents from Bushman Insurance and A & J Petersburg will be in attendance at the meeting on February 26th to provide quotes for insurance (these quotes will be for all coverage excluding health insurance).

Information was received from the Northeast Iowa Regional Housing Trust Fund. There are funds available for Calmar residents for home repairs. Residents should contact Upper Explorerland at 563-864-7551 ext. 101 or 106 for more information.
